PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

Students will center on public policy by interpreting and evaluating the policies within the government framework. Policies focused upon include federal policy, state policy, and local policy. Students take a mix of administration, management and policy courses, complemented with a required internship in a public organization.

HISTORY

Students will learn to analyze, and interpret a variety of histories, details, and timelines. Students will use a mixture of different resources to examine history.

POLITICAL COMMUNICATION

Students will focus on basic communication skills and how those influence and can be effectively used in the political domain. Jobs in this area include public relations for governments and non-profit organizations, campaign management, political journalism in electronic or print media, political speech writing and advertising, survey research, and public opinion consulting.

POLITICAL SCIENCE

Political science is the study of government and governing systems. Today political scientists are interested in many of the same normative questions that engaged ancient scholars, such as how should governments be structured and how should power be distributed. In addition, modern political scientists are concerned with accurately measuring and explaining a wide variety of political phenomena, such as voting behavior and international conflict.

SOCIAL SCIENCE TEACHING

Students prepare to teach a broad range of social studies including the fields of economics, geography, history, political science, sociology, anthropology, and psychology.
