INTERNSHIPS

I want to work at Envision Architecture in Waterloo, an architecture design firm. They have four designers and they hire summer interns. We all have to get an internship. So we've all been looking at places, but I'm specifically set on envision, because I've had 2 job shadows there, and I just really like their environment. And they work on health care projects and education projects. It's kind of similar to what I do now. It's like space planning. finalizing all the furniture and everything, and it's also the paperwork side of it, just a little bit where it's like invoices, for all the materials we have to get, and stuff like that. Our job is different every day. You won't be doing particularly the same thing unless it's a big project. Then you work on that in time increments.

I have a classmate who has an internship at a lighting place that focuses on specialty lighting.

CAREERS

Some of my classmates want to focus on residential interior design, like working with a firm that does things like specialty homes. There's homes. There's commercial. There's hospitals. And there's also the sales side of interior design.
