# **Career Cruising**

Career Cruising is a self-assessment that helps students understand their own interests, as well as explore majors and careers. We recommend that students complete the assessment and schedule a follow-up appointment with an advisor in the Office of Academic Advising to review and interpret their results. This is a great tool to help you begin the exploration process.

Follow the steps below to take Career Cruising, then fill out the worksheets to help begin the career exploration process. Completing this will be helpful as you prepare to meet with your academic advisor.

#### **Step 1: Take Career Cruising**

- Access Career Cruising by going to advising.uni.edu
- Click on the Career Cruising logo on the bottom of the website.
- When you get to the Career Cruising website, click Log In. (Contact your advisor if you are having difficulty logging in to the website).
- Next choose Create My Plan and create a profile.

- Once you have logged in, click on Assessments.
- Under Matchmaker & Skills, click Start Matchmaker and begin the assessment.
- When prompted, click Answer More Questions To Improve My Results and continue until you have answered all 116 questions.
- When finished, uncheck the High School and Two-Year Degree options on the left-hand side.
